PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE !

Summer has officially arrived along with summer vacations. As those vacations impact club attendance, it becomes a good time to begin to consider as many ideas as we can of ways to increase the involvement of players in our club games.

I know some ideas have been floating around recently but let me summarize my views on some of the issues. Attendance generally continues to be strong at our Tuesday noon games. However, our evening games (except for the monthly Unit Championship games) have attendance that is not as strong as our weekly afternoon game.

From my own viewpoint, the evening games are stuck between a rock and a hard place. Starting at 5:30, these games begin too early to attract younger players who are still working relatively fixed schedules. On the other hand, the games end too late during most of the year for our players who do not want to drive after dark. With our current playing facilities, there are severe financial disincentives if we cannot be out of the building before 9:00.

Our game room with our ability to leave the tables up and with our new chairs is a facility that may be hard to replicate. The rental rates, although recently increased, are still attractive. But the use of the facility is limited. The only times when the room is not currently being used on a regular basis are early Monday mornings, Tuesday evenings, early Thursday mornings, Fridays until 5pm, and Saturdays (unless there are special events). Each of these times presents their own issues and all evening slots still have the problem of having to be out before 9:00.

I would like to hear your thoughts both as to ways to make our evening games more attractive to our current players and ways to attract new players to our games.
